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• At the conclusion of the Sydney Easter Sale the Australasian yearling market had grossed A\$641,497,500, a manageable 4% decline from the record A\$668,555,300 gross in 2022. Champion sires **I Am Invincible** (90 sold, avg A\$685,444) and Snitzel (75 sold, avg \$522,733) between them had 165 yearlings sell for over \$100-million and accounted for 26 of the 46 A\$1-million+ yearlings (up 18% from 39 last year) at Magic Millions January and Sydney Easter. The two sires accounted for 4% of the yearlings sold, 16% of the gross, and 57% of the seven-figure yearlings.

• Second-crop sire **Good Magic**, who could have as many as three runners from his first crop in next month's G1 Kentucky Derby, also had the OBS March \$2-million sale topper. The sale grossed over US\$70-million, up 42% over the corresponding 2022 sale but more like 10% when adding in Fasig-Tipton's Gulfstream Sale, which didn't happen this year. In 2022 OBS accounted for 77% of the US 2yo market so realistic comparisons will have to wait until at least after the April (OBS Spring) sale.

• Forte is the G1 Kentucky Derby favorite having won five straight including the G1 Hopeful, G1 Breeders' Futurity, and G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile last year and the G2 Fountain of Youth and G1 Florida Derby this year but will not be as strong a favorite as his record merits as his Beyers do not separate him from the rest of the field. We nominate the Japanese-bred G2 UAE Derby winner **Derma Sotogake** as a big danger to continue the string of high-profile wins by Japanese-bred and -trained runners in big international races.

AUSTRALASIAN YEARLING MARKET SHOWS SMALL DECLINES FROM 2022 RECORDS

Though there were noticeable dips at Inglis' second-tier Classic and Melbourne sales, when all was said and done the 2023 Australasian (ANZ) yearling market through Sydney Easter experienced only small declines from record 2022 levels. Last year, according to the (unofficial) numbers we've compiled from sales company websites, 4,467 yearlings (77.1% of the 5,793 catalogued) sold for a record A\$668,555,300 through Sydney Easter, averaging A\$149,665, and including 39 A\$1m+ yearlings at Magic Millions January and Sydney Easter. This year in the corresponding sales 4,359 yearlings (75.4% of those catalogued and 2% fewer than sold last year) grossed A\$641,497,500 and averaged A\$147,166 – a 4% decline in gross (A\$27-million) and a 2% decline in average – but this year 46 yearlings (18% more than last year) made A\$1m+, highlighting the concentration in the super-elite bracket.

The ANZ sales season is bracketed by Magic Millions' Gold Coast sale in January and Inglis' Sydney Easter. Magic Millions has the highest gross (A\$243-million this year), Sydney Easter the highest average (A\$390,107). Between them the two sales accounted for 30% of the yearlings catalogued in the roughly 90-day window in which all the sales covered were held, and 60% of the gross - \$381-million. **I Am Invincible** is at this writing a little more than \$1-million in front of the 8-time NZ Champion Sire, Savabeel, in his guest for a second consecutive Champion Sire title. 'Vinnie', as he is universally known, had 90 yearlings sell over the sales season, grossing \$61,690,000 and averaging \$685,444. Snitzel had 75 sell, grossing \$39,205,000 and averaging \$522,933. The two together had 165 vearlings sell - 4% of the 4,359 total - for \$100,895,000 – 16% of the total. That's pretty staggering, that the top two sires combined had \$100-million worth of yearlings sell. Vinnie had 16 yearlings sell for \$1m+, Snitzel had 10; between them, 26 of the 46 seven-figure yearlings. So the two combined sold 4% of the yearlings for 16% of the money and 57% of the \$1m+ yearlings. Equally remarkable is that there were another 20 \$1m+ yearlings sold by other sires. It's still an exceptionally strong market, especially in the top bracket where there was, as noted, an 18% increase in the number of Magic Millions and Sydney Easter \$1m+ yearlings, from 39 last year to 46 this year.

Fifteen sires have averaged A\$195,000+ through the sales season to date. Veteran former champion sires #3 Exceed And Excel (31 sold, avg \$466,710) and #6 Fastnet Rock (26/\$408,673) were among four others who averaged \$400,000+ along with #4 Zoustar (72/\$446,381) and wunderkind F2018 #5 Extreme Choice (25/\$412,888), while another former champion sire, #7 Written Tycoon, had no fewer than 112 yearlings average \$307,108. **Pierro**, from his best book of yearlings yet, ranked #8 (47/\$267,685), while #9 and #10 by yearling average were two sires with their first 2yo's racing this year, The Autumn Sun (57/\$245,495) and Justify (42/\$244,674). They were followed by #11 Deep Field (82/\$239,602), eight-time champion NZ sire #12 Savabeel (40/\$223,633), the two top first-crop sires, both Darley - #13 Blue Point (49/\$211,973) and #14 Too Darn Hot (51/\$199,680) – and #15 So You Think (92/\$197,266).

OBS MARCH GROSS UP \$20-MILLION WITH EXTRA DAY

In 2021, OBS March plus Fasig-Tipton's Gulfstream 2-Year-Old in Training sales grossed \$63,330,000 for 392 two-year-olds sold. Last year the two sales grossed \$62,653,000 for 406 sold, though Gulfstream was down \$12-million in gross and OBS March was up \$12-million. This year, with no Gulfstream sale, OBS March grossed \$70,399,500 but for 449 sold, roughly 50 more than the average of the two previous years for the two sales combined. The bare figures say OBS March was up 42% in gross from the previous year and about 10% from the previous year's two sales combined but then again there were about 10% more horses sold as well. Moreover there's no particular reason to think that the two sales last year correlate with the one sale this year anyway. The three OBS 2yo sales (March, April, June) grossed \$168,468,500 last year, which constituted 77% of the total US 2year-old auction market of \$219-million; besides March being up \$12-million, April 2022 was up \$18-million, from \$74-million to \$92-million, while in 2021 June was up \$5-million from the pre-Covid 2019 year. The message is we'll really have to wait at least until after the OBS April sale to have any clear idea of whether the 2-year-old market is up or down and by how much. The Judges we spoke to said it was hard enough to buy at the March sale.

SECTION 3: KENTUCKY DERBY PREVIEW

FORTE LEADS KENTUCKY DERBY FIELD AFTER FINAL G1/G2 DERBY PREPS

Japan's Derma Satagoke Could Change G2 UAE Derby's Profile

Trainer Todd Pletcher is gunning for his third G1 Kentucky Derby win with three of the eight contenders who have racked up 100+ points, headed by 2022 juvenile champ Forte, who is a perfect 2-for-2 this year having taken the classic route through Florida, where he won the G2 Fountain of Youth (Beyer 98) and the G1 Florida Derby (95). The Violence colt will be the worthy favorite but not as short as he might be as his Beyers don't distance him from the field as much as his five consecutive wins in the G1 Hopeful, G1 Breeders' Futurity, G1 Breeders' Cup Juvenile, G2 Fountain of Youth, and G1 Florida Derby otherwise probably would. Win, lose, or draw in the Derby, Forte's record so far stamps him as a top-flight stallion prospect no matter what happens in Louisville or thereafter.

Three other colts are likely to be trading under 10-1 on Derby Day: Pletcher's #2 Tapit Trice, gutsy winner of the G1 Blue Grass over Brad Cox's new #2, Verifying (from Justify's first crop); Practical Move, from Practical Joke's second crop and winner of the G2 Los Al Futurity, G2 San Felipe (Beyer 100), and G1 Santa Anita Derby (100) for trainer Tim Yakteen in his last three starts; and Angel of Empire, from Classic Empire's second crop and winner of the G2 Risen Star (Beyer 89) and G1 Arkansas Derby (94) for trainer Brad Cox. Of course what we must also remember is that 3yo's in the spring won't necessarily run the same numbers at 10 furlongs as they've been running at 8 ½-9 furlongs; they have to stay to win the Derby. Forte, Tapit Trice, and Angel of Empire do look like they'll stay 10 furlongs; Practical Move is a little questionable after surviving the late charges of Japanese invader Mandarin Hero, by Shanghai Bobby, and **Skinner**, by Curlin, in the Santa Anita Derby.

The Churchill Downs points systems are not without controversy, and this year in particular the scoring of 40-30 for second and third in the 100-point races has propelled some of the horses who have run third in preps above Mandarin Hero, whose nose loss to one of the favorites should have guaranteed him a place in the field; the reasoning is there should be more of a points gap between second and third. No doubt there will be defections, but will there be enough for Mandarin Hero to get in? He's ranked #24 so needs four to come out.

Mandarin Hero's narrow second at Santa Anita is significant for another reason: he shipped from Japan. We're getting used to Japanese runners scoring on the world stage now, but they've been doing it for some time, just not in the numbers they're doing it now. I remember watching the races from Hong Kong in December 2012, when Lord Kanaloa blitzed the field the in G1 Hong Kong Sprint, and again three years later when Maurice was the impressive winner of the G1 Hong Kong Mile; and Orfevre famously snatched defeat from the jaws of victory in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe on heavy going in 2015. All three, by the way, are now very successful sires in Japan, and Maurice is very successful in Australia as well, where Arrowfield's John Messara has long been an advocate of Japanese breeding (Maurice shuttles to Arrowfield).

"What's past is prologue", Shakespeare famously wrote in The Tempest, and so it seems these earlier salvos laid the groundwork for Japanese horses announcing themselves on the world stage in convincing fashion. The current era of Japanese influence began at the Breeders' Cup at Del Mar on November 6, 2021, when the man with the stylish hats, Yoshito Yahagi, trained the winners of two Breeders' Cup races, Loves Only You (by Deep Impact) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf, and Marche Lorraine (by Orfevre) in the G1 Breeders' Cup Distaff on dirt. Three and a half months later Japanese horses won four G3 races all ridden by French transplant Christophe Lemaire - on the Saudi Cup undercard, for four different trainers, including Yahagi. His winner, the then-7yo Stay Foolish (by Orfevre's sire Stay Gold, like Deep Impact a son of Sunday Silence) doubled up the next month in the G2 Dubai Gold Cup, and was one of five winners - three trained by Yahagi - on the 2022 Dubai World Cup undercard, including Panthalassa (by Lord Kanaloa), who dead-heated with Lord North in the G1 Dubai Turf, and Shahayr (by Deep Impact), who won the G1 Sheema Classic.

Japanese horses won 'just' three races on the Saudi Cup card, and another three on the Dubai World Cup card, this year, but they included the now-5yo Panthalassa, who won the G1 Saudi Cup,

and 6yo Ushba Tesoro (another by Orfevre), who won the G1 Dubai World Cup. But there were two other very significant wins on the Dubai undercard: the 4yo Equinox, from the first crop of Kitasan Black (a son of Deep Impact's full brother, Black Tide), made himself the world's #1 racehorse thus far in 2023 with a scorching win in the G1 Sheema Classic, running a Racing Post Rating (RPR) of 129; and the 3yo Derma Sotogake (by Mind Your Biscuits) led home a Japanese 1-2-3-4 in the G2 UAE Derby, worth 100 points to the winner on the Churchill Downs list and gaining himself a spot in the G1 Kentucky Derby. The UAE Derby third Continuar (by Drefong) is also guaranteed a run by virtue of his runs in gualifying races in Japan. Both Mind Your Biscuits and Drefong, by the way, were high-class American dirt horses bought for stud by Shadai. Drefong, the best horse sired by Tale of the Cat's son Gio Ponti, won the 2016 G1 King's Bishop and G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint and was named Champion sprinter; he also won the G1 Forego as a 4yo, and Continuar is from his second crop. Mind Your Biscuits, by Silver Deputy's son Posse out of a mare by Awesome Again's son Toccet (so is inbred 3x4 to Deputy Minister!), won the G1 Malibu and the G1 Golden Shaheen in Dubai twice and placed in five other G1's from 6f-9f including the G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint twice (the first as a 3yo, to Drefong), the Cigar Mile, the Met Mile, and the Whitney. Derma Sotogake is from his first crop.

This is all relevant to the 2023 Kentucky Derby because of one form line and two speed figures. The form line is this: Mandarin Hero came into the Santa Anita Derby 4-for-5 lifetime, his only defeat coming in February when he was second to a horse named Hero Call. In his previous race, last December, Hero Call was fourth, beaten 4L, by none other than Derma Sotogake. That, in theory at least, means Derma Sotogake should beat Mandarin Hero – and, if the form can be taken literally and if Mandarin Hero ran a Beyer 100, it means Derma Sotogake would run around a Beyer 105, which would be the highest Beyer number in the field. This form line is reinforced by another speed figure, which is the Racing Post Rating (RPR) 120 which Derma Sotogake ran when he demolished the UAE Derby field by 5 1/2L. We find Beyers usually range from 12-18 points below RPR's and average 15 points, which means Derma Sotogake's RPR translates to at least 102 but more likely 105 – the exact figure we come up with on a line through Mandarin Hero. It all adds up to Derma Sotogake being, by this reasoning, the

biggest threat to Forte. In handicapping terms, if Derma Sotogake is a bigger price than Tapit Trice (Beyer 99) and Practical Move (100), he's an overlay. And by the way, the median Beyer for the Kentucky Derby for the last 10 years (discounting the September 2020 Derby) is 102, with a range of 97-105. The only negative to Derma Sotogake's chances, assuming he's shipped ok and will run his race, is that no winners of the UAE Derby have ever got close in Kentucky; but then, none of them were from Japan.

Forte, for us, is still the right favorite – he has the right connections and the right preparation. But we'll sure be using Derma Sotogake in the gimmicks, and for a live longshot – depending if and how he runs in the April 15 G3 Lexington S. – we'll suggest G2 Rebel S. winner Confidence Game (Beyer 94), by Candy Ride out of a Bernardini half-sister to Zenyatta, from trainer Keith Desormeaux. That's, tentatively of course this far out, my 2023 G1 Kentucky Derby Trifecta box.
